

Stark County 4-H Gold Medal Nomination Form

- · Nominations forms must be returned to the Stark County Office (2800 Richville Drive, Massillon 44646) by October 1 postmark not accepted.
- The Gold Medal Awards are used to recognize members who have shown outstanding effort and personal increase of knowledge and skill, as well as outstanding achievement in their project category.
- · Any advisor or 4-H volunteer may nominate any 4-H member. The 4-H member does not have to be a member of the advisor's club. The member must be in good standing to be eligible to receive the award.
- · 4-H members may only be nominated in one project area annually and must have taken that project at least two years including the current year.
- · Up to three members, in each project area, may be selected for recognition. The top member will be awarded a gold medal project pin and a certificate. The two runners-ups will receive a honorable mention certificate.
- · A member may only receive the award for a project area once, but is eligible to receive the award in another project area.
- The awards committee will determine the top recipient based on the following criteria and weight: Citizenship and Leadership (worth 20 points), Personal Initiative (worth 20 points), Club Participation (worth 20 points) and Growth in project area (worth 40 points) equaling 100 total possible points.
- · Advisors are asked to collaborate when completing nomination forms as to not duplicate efforts for one member.
