Participation Guidelines: 4-Hers who take more than one clothing project must complete separate learning experiences related to each including creating a separate, total look outfit for EACH project. Members must wear project garments at Clothing Judging. (dressing rooms will be provided) This is so the judge can evaluate the proper fit. Garments will be judged for construction, and a construction award will be given.

Style Revue- Style Revue is a fashion show that the youth will be able to showcase their outfits during the project judging event. Those interested in participating will need to complete a narration card. This will be provided to you on judging day. All 4-H members must attend a **Sewing Skillathon** before county judging.

409* Sew Fun	Junior – 8 to 10 Senior – 11 and up	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - Wear the garment you made using an “easy” or beginner” pattern (skirt, shorts, pants or capris with a full elastic waistline) and accessories for a total look. -Bring your pin cushion and sewing box to judging. 412* Sew for Others	Junior 8-13 Senior 14-18	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge -Construct one complete outfit for the person of your choice OR adapt three different garments for someone with a disability - it is desirable, but required, for the "other" to be present to show an outfit you made at the judging and Style Revue. If the other cannot be present, simply bring the garment you made to show the judge and to exhibit in the Style Revue. We limit the number of "others" and outfits to no more than one "other" outfit per entrant. Choose one outfit that best represents your work to the judging event. However, you will be judged on mastery of the project book rather than the outfit worn unless the outfit was put together to complete an activity within the project -Bring completed poster, pages, or visual showing completed activities.
